You can find out if someone is right for the job by giving them a trial.

Kayleigh said that social services give you money to pay for your personal assistant but you pay some money for them too.



You also have to pay for a personal assistant's petrol and insurance.



If you have a personal assistant it is important to have respect for them and be flexible if you can.
